ASSEMBLY

AWARNING

Recharge only with the charger specified for the battery. For specific charging instructions, read the operator's manual supplied with your charger and battery.

Inserting/Removing Battery Pack Insert the battery pack by sliding battery pack into the body of the tool. Insert the battery pack until the

To remove the battery pack, press in both battery latches and slide the battery pack off of the tool.

AWARNING

To reduce the risk of injury, do not look directly into the light when the light is on.

Pull the trigger to turn the light on or off. Pull part way for momentary light. Pull fully and release to lock on. Pull fully and release again to turn off.
Use the mode button to select the brightness. The last selected mode will default when the trigger is pulled.

MAINTENANCE

To reduce the risk of injury, always unplug the charger and remove the battery pack from the charger or tool before performing any maintenance. Never disassemble the tool, battery pack or charger. Contact a

Maintain lightKeep your light, battery pack and charger in good repair by adopting a regular maintenance program. If the light does not work properly, return the light to a MILWAUKEE service facility for repairs.

To reduce the risk of personal injury and damage, never immerse your AWARNING To reduce the risk of personal injury and damage, never immerse your tool, battery pack or charger in liquid or allow a liquid to flow inside them.

CleaningKeep tool handles clean, dry and free of oil or grease. Use only mild soap and a damp cloth to clean the tool, battery pack and charger since certain cleaning agents and solvents are harmful to plastics and other insulated parts. Some of these include gasoline, turpentine, lacquer thinner, paint thinner, chlorinated cleaning solvents, ammonia and household detergents containing ammonia. Never use solvents around tools.
