a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.

- 17. If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protected supply. Use of a GFCI reduces the risk of electric shock.
- Use power tool ONLY on adequately rated circuits to avoid overheating of electrical systems.
- 19. Prevent accidental starting. Ensure switch is in the "OFF" position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energizing power tools that have the switch "ON" invites accidents.
- 20. Never let the power tool operate while unattended and unplug when not in use or before servicing.
- Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- 22. Never use this tool without the proper guard. The grinding wheel could shatter during use. Make sure the guard covers the side of the wheel facing you.
- 23. Never bounce the tool while grinding. This may crack the wheel.
- 24. Grinding metal will cause sparks! Keep them directed away from people and flammable materials. Always keep the guard positioned so that as much of the exposed disc as possible is pointing away from you.
- 25. Keep children and pregnant women away from the work area until the grinding is completed and the area has been cleaned up.
- 26. Always wear full eye, face and body protection. Wire bristles may break off and fly toward the user. Always wear ear protection when grinding in enclosed spaces. Noise level may be amplified in such locations and may cause permanent hearing loss.
- 27. Always wear an OSHA approved dusk mask or respirator when inside the work area. Replace the filter daily. NOTE: Not all dust masks offer protection from lead paint dust. Be sure to use the proper mask for the job.
- 28. Before connecting the tool to the power supply follow the safety instructions for installing the grinding or cutting wheels. Do not lock the wheels too tight or cracks may occur.
- Only use grinding or cutting wheels with the correct bore size for the spindle of the grinder.
- Use standard parts. Do not use coolant or water and do not use as a fixed grinder.
- Do not start the tool when the grinding or cutting wheels are touching the work area.
- Keep the power cord well away from the cutting area during use. Always position the cord so that

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it will not be caught in the workpiece when the grinder is in use.

- Always have the guards in place and properly positioned when using grinding wheels or wire cup brushes.
- 34. Secure the material being grinded. Never hold it in your hand or across your legs. Do not use your legs or feet to stabilize the workpiece. Unstable support can cause loss of control and could result in lacerations or injury.
- 35. Use clamps or other practical ways to secure and support the workpiece to a stable platform.
- 36. Always make sure no one, including the user, is in line with the tool when starting the motor.
- 37. Always use both hands when operating the Angle Grinder.
- 38. Always hold this tool by the insulated gripping surfaces. If this tool should accidentally cut across its own cord or hidden wiring, all exposed metal parts will become live and could seriously shock the user.
- 39. When using the Angle Grinder, always maintain a firm grip on the tool. Keep your hands well away from the grinding wheel or brush. Never reach underneath the Angle Grinder while the sanding disk is in motion.
- 40. When the Angle Grinder is in operation, keep hands away from the cutting or grinding area.
- Do not run the Angle Grinder while carrying it at your side. A moving grinding wheel or brush could cause lacerations or personal injury.
- 42. The disc will not stop immediately when the Angle Grinder is turned off. Exercise caution.
- Do not set the Angle Grinder down after use until the grinding or cutting wheels have come to a complete stop.
- 44. Keep the handle of the Angle Grinder dry, clean and free from oil and grease.
- 45. Only use grinding and cutting wheels that are approved for a maximum speed of 11,000 RPM

or greater.

- 46. After replacing a wheel or brush, always let the tool run for one minute in a well-protected area. If the new accessory has an undetected flaw, it should break apart in less than a minute.
- 47. Unplug Angle Grinder from power supply and place the switch in the locked or "OFF" position before making any assembly adjustments, changing accessories or performing any inspection, maintenance or cleaning procedures. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the tool accidentally. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the tool accidentally which could cause serious personal injury.
- 48. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts, and any other condition that may affect the tool's operation. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained tools.
- 49. Maintain labels and nameplates on the Angle Grinder. These carry important information. If unreadable or missing, contact Performance Tool® for a replacement.
- 50. Do not disassemble the angle grinder.
- 51. Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained. Follow instructions in the Maintenance section of this manual. Use of unauthorized parts or failure to follow Maintenance Instructions may create a risk of shock or injury.
- ▲ WARNING: Some dust created by power sanding contains chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. An example of this type of chemical is lead from lead based paints, Crystalline Silica from bricks and cement or other masonry, Arsenic and Chromium from chemically treated lumber. GROUNDING

▲ WARNING: Improperly connecting the grounding wire can result in the risk of electric shock. Check with a qualified electrician if you are in doubt as to whether the outlet is properly grounded. Do not modify the power cord plug provided with the tool. Never remove the grounding prong from the plug. Do not use the tool if the power cord or plug is damaged. If damaged, have it repaired by a service facility before use. If the plug will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

GROUNDED TOOLS: TOOLS WITH THREE PRONG PLUGS

- Tools marked with "Grounding Required" have a three wire cord and three prong grounding plug. The plug must be connected to a properly grounded outlet. If the tool should electrically malfunction or break down, grounding provides a low resistance path to carry electricity away from the user, reducing the risk of electric shock. (See Figure A.)
- The grounding prong in the plug is connected through the green wire inside the cord to the grounding system in the tool. The green wire in the cord must be the only wire connected to the tool's grounding system and must never be attached to an electrically "live" terminal. (See Figure A.)
- 3. Your tool must be plugged into an appropriate outlet, properly installed and



grounded in accordance with all codes and ordinances. The plug and outlet should look like those in the following illustration. (See Figure A)

DOUBLE INSULATED TOOLS: TOOLS WITH TWO PRONG PLUGS

- Tools marked "Double Insulated" do not require grounding. They have a special double insulation system which satisfies OSHA requirements and complies with the applicable standards of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., the Canadian Standard Association, and the National Electrical Code. (See Figure B.)
- 2. Double insulated tools may be used in either of the 120 volt outlets shown in the following illustration. (See Figure B.)

EXTENSION CORDS –

Use only accessories that are recommended by the manufacturer for your model. Accessories that may be suitable for one tool may become hazardous when used on another tool.

Always attach grounded (3-prong) extension cords to grounded (3-hole) outlets. If you must use an extension cord, be sure



that the gauge is large enough to carry the amount of current necessary for your power tool. If not, your tool may experience a loss of power, excessive voltage drop or overheating. The smaller the gauge number, the heavier the cord (see table on next page).

ASSEMBLY

ATTACHING AUXILIARY HANDLE

This tool comes with an auxiliary handle which can be attached to different sides of the Angle Grinder, depending on the preference of the operator. This handle is necessary to maintain complete control of the tool and should be used at all times. Make sure this handle is always fastened securely.



ATTACHING WHEEL GUARD

- ▲ CAUTION Never brush or grind without the guard in place. Brushes are considered to be grinding wheels and must also be used with guards.
- 1. Always unplug the tool before attempting to change the guard or accessories.
- 2. Set the Angle Grinder on a flat surface with the spindle facing up.
- 3. Place the guard clamp over spindle head assemble.
- 4. Rotate guard to desired location.
- 5. Tighten clamp screw with a Phillips screwdriver.
- 6. Make sure that the guard is securely tightened in place.



7. To remove guard, loosen clamp screw and lift guard up while slightly rotating.

ASSEMBLY

ATTACHING GRINDING WHEEL OR CUTTING DISC

- 1. Unplug the grinder.
- 2. Turn the tool upside down.
- 3. Place the inner flange on the spindle so that it matches with the flats on the shaft.
- 4. Fit the disc over the boss on the inner flange.
- 5. Screw the wheel-retaining nut down over the disc. Depending on the disc thickness, the boss on the outer flange nut can face down or up.

ATTACHING WHEELS WITH DEPRESSED CENTERS -

- A WARNING Always check the tool warning label for the recommended speed rating on accessories. Never run a wheel or brush over the rated speed. Accessories exceeding the recommended speed may fly apart and cause serious personal injury.
- **NOTE** Hubbed wheels do not require mounting flanges.
- 1. Place the inner flange over the spindle making sure the fit is tight.
- 2. Place the grinding or cutting disc on the top of the inner flange ensuring the bore fits into the step of the flange.
- 3. Mount the concave recess side of the outer flange nut over the spindle.

OPERATION

AWARNING READ ALL WARNINGS IN THIS MANUAL BEFORE OPERATING THIS TOOL.

USING THE ON/OFF SWITCH

- **AWARNING** Never switch the Angle Grinder "ON" or "OFF" while under load conditions.
- 1. When starting hold the Angle Grinder firmly with both hands. One hand on the rear handle or the motor housing and the other hand on the side handle.
- 2. To turn the Angle Grinder "ON" without locking it, push the switch up without putting pressure on the switch. When pressure is released, the switch snaps to the "OFF" position.
- 4. To lock the switch "ON", press the switch button up while pressing down.

- To unlock the switch, simply press and release the back (grooved) part of the switch. Switch is spring loaded and will snap back automatically.
- ▲ CAUTION Always allow the Angle Grinder to come up to full speed before touching any surface. Always take the tool away from the workpiece before turning the tool "OFF". Let the tool come to a complete stop before setting it down. This tool operates best under light pressure. Exerting heavy pressure will not speed up the work and may cause damage to the motor.

OPERATION

USING THE ANGLE GRINDER

- This angle grinder is designed to accept only 4-1/2" abrasive discs with a 5/8" bore. Check to ensure that any discs used on this machine are rated for the 12,000 /min speed of this grinder. Check also for any damage to an abrasive disc before installing. Any disc that is cracked, has been dropped, or subjected to other damage due to temperature extremes or solvents should be discarded. A damaged disc can fly apart in use and may cause serious injury to the operator or bystanders
- 1. Plug in the tool.
- 2. Hold the tool firmly with one hand on the side handle and the other gripping the housing. Check to make sure the abrasive disc is not obstructed. Slide the switch on the Top of the machine forward with your thumb. Switching the tool on or off under load will damage the switch.

- **NOTE** For best tool control, material removal and minimal loading, keep the angle between the disc and the work surface at approximately 30° when grinding and 10°-15° when sanding.
- 3. To turn the tool off, slide the switch back.
- **WARNING:** Turn off your tool at once, unplug and inspect it for serious problems if:
 - Moving parts get stuck
 - · Speed drops to an abnormally low level
 - The motor housing gets hot
 - · Sparks or odors emit from the casing

CARE & MAINTENANCE

- ▲ WARNING Always turn power switch to "OFF" position and unplug power cord from electrical outlet before attempting cleaning or maintenance.
- ▲ NOTICE This power tool is lubricated before it leaves the factory. This lubrication should last for the life of the tool. No further lubrication is required.

The armature and motor are the heart of the power tool. Exercise care to ensure they do not become damaged or effected by oil or water.

Inspect the carbon brushes regularly and replace them when they are worn. (about 1/3 of the way up)

Regularly inspect all mountings and screws and ensure they are properly tightened. Failure to do so may result in serious damage.

Consult an authorized maintenance service agent in event of damage.

Clean and dust the Angle Grinder after each use. Use compressed air to blow out any accumulated dust or grit. Tiny particles from metal grinding often accumulate inside your tool and could create an electrical shock hazard.

Never use solvents or harsh chemicals. Use only mild soap and a damp cloth to clean the tool. Never let any liquid get inside the casing. Never immerse any part of the tool in a liquid. Always keep the ventilation openings clear.

Regularly clean the ventilation slots in your tool using a soft brush or dry cloth.

- 1. Do not cover exhaust vents when the Angle Grinder is in use. This may cause damage to the motor and reduce efficiency.
- 2. Guide back and forth over the work piece in a steady motion.
- 3. When cutting avoid tilting the Angle Grinder in the cutting plane. Ensure the cutting wheel has a clean cutting edge.
- 4. To cut hard stone a diamond cutting wheel is recommended.
- 5. Do nut use cutting wheel for rough grinding.
